

FRANÇOIS RICHARD Quartet

Bop-angled flute is not easy, neither to play nor to have balanced against typical rhythm set-ups. Perhaps in recognition of this FRANCOIS RICHARD gives over equal production weight to his pianist lean Beaudet, who busily comps whether Richard's playing heads alongside him or not. So it is that Richard comes off as an astute technician and soloist in control of the higher register but not at all prone to it. Instead the flute stavs cushioned in the mid-register, helped in its positioning by Pierre Tanguay's time-clock exact drumming. Not many all-flute albums see air these days, and this is a high spot for the continuum.
